

ACTIVITY: LEARN TO MAKE THE GHOST OF CHRISTMAS PAST'S HEADDRESS FROM A *CHRISTMAS CAROL*

RECOMMENDED AGE: 5 and up

TIME: 30 minutes

SET-UP: Adults – younger children might need assistance in the construction of their headdress.

SUPPLIES:

- **Colored construction paper (or, you can use any paper and color it yourself)**
- **Colored markers, pencils, or crayons**
- **A stapler**
- **Scissors**



INSTRUCTIONS

1. First, select the colors you would like to use for your headdress. Christmas Past's headdress is white, so we recommend using white or a cool colored paper like blue or light purple. If you want to use more than one color, that is fine too!
2. Cut a 2" wide (about the length of your thumb) strip of paper with your scissors. This strip will be the main band of your headdress, so make sure to measure that this strip will fit around your head!
 - a. If you want to color this strip, you should do this now.
3. With your remaining construction paper, cut ½" to 1" strips. These strips should be varied in length.
 - a. If you want to color this strip, you should do this now.
 - b. If you have other craft supplies in the house, feel welcome to use them! We recommend ribbon, fabric pieces, and yarn for this part.
4. Next, wrap these strips around a pencil or marker so they curl up. The more wraps around, the more curl the paper will have.
5. Now you're ready to put it all together! Take the main band of construction paper (from step 2) and staple the two ends together so you have a circle. Then, take the individual strips (from step 3) and staple these to the top of the circular band.
6. You're finished! Now you have an incredible headdress just like Christmas Past!
