When does your play happen?


Don't worry about the logistics of making it work on a stage yet. These questions are more about how the setting influences your storytelling!


USE YOUR IMAGINATION


Who do you expect to be in these locations?

OR Who is the last person you would expect?










How might these settings influence the story of the people in them?

SOME THINGS TO CONSIDER -






